

**SUMMER SCHOOL IN LITERARY STATISTICS
CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY, ENGLAND**

13 - 19 JULY 1975

Arrangements have been made to hold a summer school on the subject of literary statistics, the duration of which is to be one week. There will be three types of sessions : main lectures, guest lectures, tutorials. The main lectures will be given by Mr N.D. Thomson of IBM and Southampton University, and will include estimation and confidence intervals, design of experiments, analysis of variance. The guest lectures will probably be Mr H. Sykes-Davies (Cambridge), the Rev. A.Q. Morton (Edinburgh), Professor Y.T. Radday (Haifa), Professor R.W. Bailey (Michigan) and Professor K.W. Kemp (Cardiff). In addition to tutorial sessions for exercises based on the lectures, there will be discussions on the statistical validity of the work carried out, and practical demonstrations.

The course fee will be approximately £20 for non-members of the ALLC and £17 for ALLC members. This includes lectures, tutorials, and on-line computer work. Accommodation will be available in Newnham College and the accommodation fee of about £30 will cover a room and all meals from dinner on Sunday 13 July to breakfast on Saturday 19 July.
